Bala Devi Chandrashekar is an acclaimed senior artist, choreographer and teacher of Indian Classical Dance - Bharata Nrityam. Trained under eminent Guru, the noted Bharata Nrityam exponent Dr. Padma Subrahmanyam, Bala works on developing and perfecting the style that would be seamless and fluid while retaining the precision, power and purity of line typical of classical dance.

YAKSHAGANA FOLK THEATER *Yakshagana* is the most popular traditional theatre form combining dance, music, spoken word, costume-makeup, and stage technique with a distinct style and form. The stories of Indian mythology and epics – *Ramayana*, *Mahabharata* and *Puranas* with their world of Gods, Demons and super human beings are artistically depicted. *Yakshagana* comes from the coastal districts and adjacent areas in Karnataka, and it's one of the major living art traditions in India.
