


Bharatanatyam Virtuoso Bala Devi Chandrashekar Mesmerizes Audiences at India House

It conveyed the powerful concept of Shiva Shakti Swaroopa through Pathanjali's hymn, lending itself to prosperity- Mahalakshmi and fertility- Bhuma Devi; the dance unfolded with verses of sage Pathanjali, visualizing the magnificent sight of the cosmic dance.

Bala Devi Chandrashekar concluded her performance with a profound message of Vasudhaiva kutumbakam – one earth and one family – the interconnectedness of nature and human life, emphasizing that we are all integral parts of creation's grand design.
